- Building opened on March 1st 1976

- 5 English and 4 FI classes

- 81% graduate with an academic diploma as compared to the 73% provincial result

Level 1 Transition

- No social promotion to the next grade in high school
- Promotion is based on a credit system that requires certain credits to be earned in particular subject areas
- Parents will receive a transcript of grades each year from the department of education based on report cards
- Students must obtain **36** out of 42 possible credits
- Three year program – 14 credits/yr
(7 courses per year)
- A fourth year is available to students if they need it to complete the requirements

French Immersion (FI)

- FI students are required to complete 6 courses over three years to receive a FI designation on their transcript
- Grade 10 – Francais 1202 and Carriere et Vie 2231
- Grade 11 – Francais 2202 and one of Geographie du Canada 1231 or Histoire du Canada 1231
- Grade 12 – Francais 3202 and Histoire Mondiale 3231

Level 1 Transition

- FI and English stream students will be mixed together in 5 of 7 courses each year
- Parents have access to grades and attendance on-line using the PowerSchool Parent Portal

Grade 9 vs. Level 1

- Students will write mid-year and final exams in core courses such as:

Math, Science, English and Social Studies

- Important to emphasize this is a normal progression in student schooling – exams represent 20-40% of a final grade in most courses
- They provide students opportunities to demonstrate their knowledge and improve or replace missing assessments

Grade 9 vs. Level 1

- Students do not go to class by home room
- Instead they choose courses and are placed in classes based on those selections
- Can have grade 10, 11 and 12 students in some elective courses

The Credit System

- High school courses are worth 1 or 2 credits
- 1 credit course = Half a school year of study
- 1 credit courses are paired together for a total of 2 credits Ex. Phys. Ed. 2100/2101
- 2 credit course = Full year of instruction
- Most courses are 2 credit and run from Sept. to June

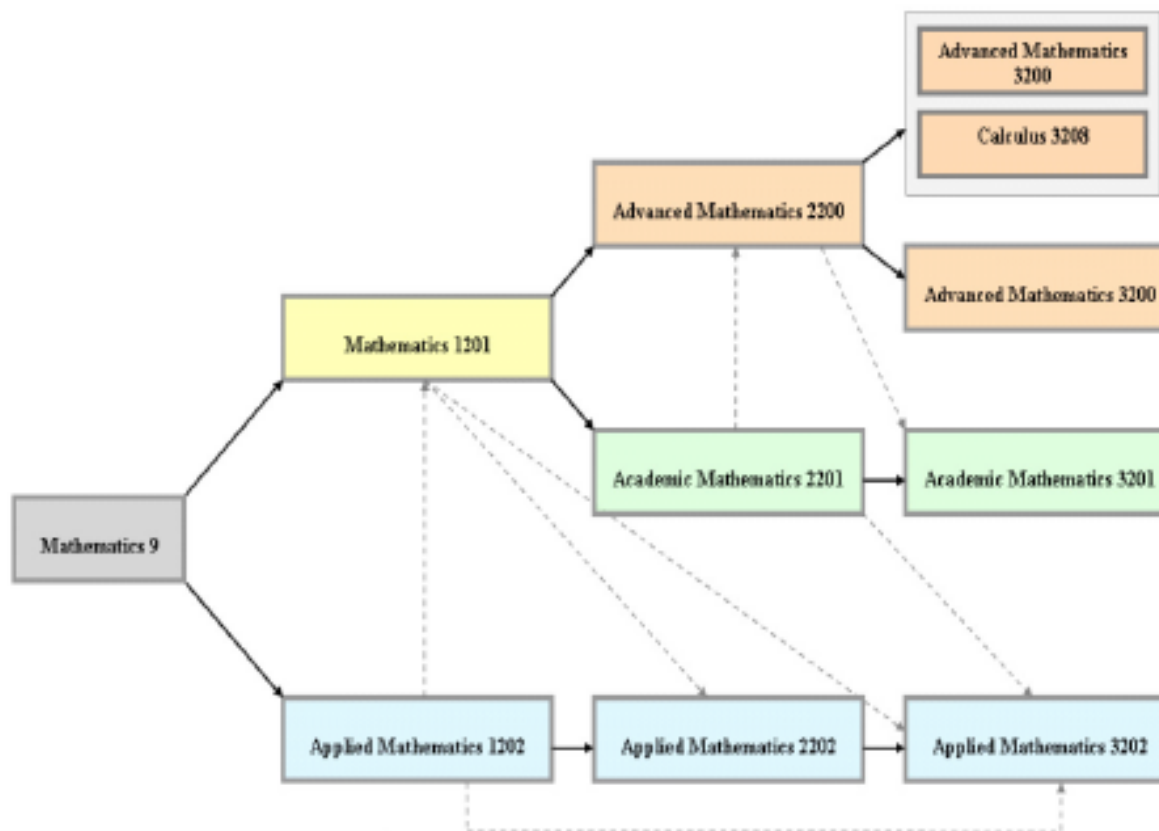
Language and French Immersion

Writing 2203 Option

- This course will provide students with the foundation needed for high school courses that is not covered in previous curriculum
- Develop essay writing technique and research skills that will be required in the English 1201 research paper
- All students should choose writing unless you are intending to do all advanced math and calculus courses as well as three 3000 level science courses (Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Earth Science)
- Only need one 3000 level Math and Science to graduate

Elective Courses

- Students should select elective courses after selecting core courses
- Elective courses will be offered every year so you can take them in any year
- French Immersion students doing a double science will not have any electives in level 1 if they take the Writing 2203 option
- There is much more flexibility in year 2 and 3

Physical Education

- 2 credits required over three years

Healthy Living 1200 is recommended for non-competitive students;

60% class activity; 40% low impact fitness activity

Physical Education 2100/2101 and 3100/3101 is recommended for student athletes

Students can do a fitness-focused PE 3100/3101 for student athletes

Career Development 2201/ Carrière et Vie 2231

- Required for Graduation
- 30 hour Community Service component required to be completed over 3 years of high school – can get up to 15 hours now
- Guidelines posted on our website under “Students/Parents” section
- French Immersion students will complete this course in Level 1
- English stream students complete this course in level 2
